 - A. That kindness can be shown.
 - B. That the covenant made can be carried out.
 - C. That he could share his memories of his friend.
- 2. There is reverence given to the king. V. 6
 - A. Amazed to be in front of the king.
 - B. He felt the kindness of the king.
 - C. He was told to "fear not" he was where he needed to be.
- 3. There is a restored estate by the king. V. 7 & 9
 - A. He is as a son to the king. V 7
 - B. He is looked after in spite of his weakness. V13
 - C. Restored back in royalty.

Application for us today.

- 1. There's been a covenant given and a request sent out.
 - A. David is an example of what Jesus is for us. 1Co.11:25
 - B. Mephibosheth is an example of what we are.
- 2. He wasn't seeking kindness; the consideration was by someone else.
- 3. The Lord Jesus wants to share with us all about the Father. Jn. 14:26
- 4. The Lord Jesus says. "fear not, I am with you".
- 5. Restored to royalty 1Pe.2:9

6. Just as David sent out servants to help v10 & 11 Jesus is telling us to go out. Lk. 14:23

7. David could have overlooked the covenant with Jonathan, but he chose to show kindness because kindness was shown to him.
